



Joint Statement of The Registration Council for Clinical Physiologists and The Register of Clinical Technologists

The Registration Council for Clinical Physiologists (RCCP) and the Register of Clinical Technologists (RCT) have entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) in order to formalise and strengthen their relationship.

Both organisations are accredited registers with the Professional Standards Authority (PSA) and recognise their mutual aims and objectives, one of the primary aims being to achieve statutory regulation for clinical physiologists and technologists, for the better protection of the public.

The principles and aims of this MoU will formalise the commitment to continue to work together and where appropriate, with other appropriate PSA accredited registers. Both organisations will agree to share information on standards, entry requirements, and register policies and procedures for the sole purpose of aligning the registers into a 'cluster' arrangement, at the same time respecting each other's independent regulatory status.

This announcement, together with the MoU represents a strong commitment to strengthen the regulation of non-statutory regulated healthcare practitioners and technologists in the United Kingdom.

Paul Burgess MBE Chair of the RCCP said:

"The RCCP is delighted to have signed a MoU with the RCT. Both organisations are totally committed to the campaign for the statutory regulation of clinical physiologists and we look forward to jointly working on this and other areas of mutual interest."

Iain Threlkeld, RCT Registrar said:

"The RCT and the RCCP are both well-established registers, who have long held the common goal of statutory registration. We welcome the signing of this MOU and fully expect this to be the start of a very productive working relationship.
