

Elected Registrant Representative to the Register of Clinical Technologists (RCT) Management Board

Term of Office	3 years. Registrant representatives may stand for re-election at the end of their term. The role is appointed through open election amongst Registrants.
Meetings	There are generally three scheduled panel meetings per year which panel are expected to attend. These are normally held in October, February and June. The Board currently holds on meeting per year in person, with the remaining meetings held online.
Why volunteer?	Sharing your professional knowledge, enthusiasm and personal time means we can work together in promoting the RCT's aim of protecting the public by advocating statutory, professional regulation for Clinical Technologists. It is a great way to build your professional network; meet like-minded people and also gain exposure to new ideas and opportunities you may not have exposure to elsewhere. This can be personally fulfilling, help you plan and achieve next career steps, and contribute to shaping the RCT's activities during your tenure and beyond.
Where does this role fit in?	The Registrant Representative represents the interests of registrants on the RCT Management Board. You will support the governing of the RCT register, helping to ensure high standards are maintained at that the RCT continues to fulfil the requirements of its' PSA accreditation.
Who can apply?	Desirable experience, skills and attributes are listed below. This role is suitable for any current RCT Registrants. Applications are currently particularly welcome from registered Sonographers. Different workplaces (industry, academia, NHS, private etc.) and all training backgrounds are welcome, including unique career pathways.
Examples of work	The members of the panel will contribute towards the policies, procedures and principles which are part of the operation of the Register and contribute to the overall direction of the Register.
Time Commitment	There are generally three scheduled panel meetings per year which panel are expected to attend. Communication via email or Teams is conducted as and when required. We don't anticipate the commitment to exceed one hour per week on average.
What you get out of it	Help develop the careers of those within the same profession through recognition and feedback of those applying for professional registration
Support available	Staff support at the IPEM national office, as well as support from peers on the management board.

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Eligibility Requirements

Membership	Must be an RCT Registrant.
Experience	Have experience as a Clinical Technologist in one of the current RCT scopes of practice. Experience of volunteering with relevant professional bodies or within a professional register is desirable.
Skills and Attributes	• Proven analytical and decision-making skills. • Be able to grasp detail and contribute to objective decision-making by exercising sound judgment. • Good oral and written communication skills • Actively listen to others and have regard for their views. • Ability to make reasoned, unbiased and, on occasion, very challenging decisions affecting other people. • Demonstrable integrity and respect for others. • Understanding of the need to handle sensitive and confidential information appropriately and in line with RCT guidelines • Have experience as a Clinical Technologist in one of the current RCT scopes of practice. • A current registration with the RCT is not required but familiarity with RCT application requirements, the RCT CPD standards and code of conduct would be beneficial.
